## **Primary Sport Premium Funding 2016-2017**

## What is Primary Sport Premium Funding?

The Government is continuing to provide funding of £150 million per annum for the academic year 2016-17 as the School Sport Premium. The money is to be spent on improving the quality of Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity for all children. This money can only be spent on Physical Education, School Sport and its provision for encouraging Healthy Lifestyle choices both within and outside of school hours.

We currently offer a variety of extra-curricular and lunch time clubs, led by our own staff. In addition, we have strong links with local organisations including Darlington Table Tennis and The Martin Grey Academy. We have a group of children who lead lunchtime activities on the play-ground, this is a direct result of the Playmakers Award.

In the financial year for 2016-2017 we will receive £9195 Sports Premium Funding. The table below shows our targets, how the funding will be spent in order to achieve that target and the outcome for the children at our school. This is subject to change depending upon unforeseen opportunities for example:

- From September 2016, swimming lessons will be provided for all children (Y3 upwards) terms will be allocated by the Sports Coordinator.
- Coaches, through the Bronze package, are allocated to year groups (sometimes last minute) depending upon competitions.
- Cancellation of activities.

We have identified four key areas on which we focus to improve outcomes for the children of our school.

- All children (Year 3 upwards) are given the opportunity to begin to learn to swim
- Children are exposed to the knowledge of those with expertise in sports
- Children are exposed to sports competition
