Primary PE and Sport Premium PLAN for 2015-16 Corporation Road Primary School

The Primary PE and Sport Premium was launched by the government in April 2013 and is available for three years to July 2016. It is ring-fenced funding to be used by our school to improve the quality and breadth of our PE, sport and physical activity provision.

The national vision is for "all pupils leaving primary school [to be] physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport".

In addition to the funding, our school has a strong commitment to high quality PE and sport, which was recognised externally by Tees Valley Sport in its recent case study to the Department for Education. For example we already have an extensive range of sporting extra-curricular activities organised and delivered by our own staff and other community partners. These include our award winning Energy Club for KS1 and snooker at our local club, owned by a school governor. We also value the motivation gained from attending high quality live sport as evidenced in our two day visit to Glasgow 2014. Our staff act as excellent role models, one manifestation of which is their participation in the Tees Valley Workplace Challenge. Also unrelated to the PE and Sport Premium, in 2014-15 we received funding from Sport England for a new outdoor multi-sport area on the school playground. This now adds to our formal and informal provision.

In financial year 2015-16 we will receive £8,500 Premium funding. The details below show how we will spend this and what impact it will have on our pupils. It must be noted that this plan is subject to change in order to take advantage of unforeseen opportunities which may arise. For example in 2014-15, initial plans did not include additional dance and volleyball coaching. Similarly we only began to access the excellent Darlington Table Tennis Academy facilities during the mid-year, therefore it is appropriate that the plan below will evolve accordingly.
