Read the text carefully and then answer the following questions. Try to use a similar sequence to those we used in school.

Monday

You might want to start off by reading through the text and underline the words you are unsure of and create a definition for these words. Then go back through the text and read it again substituting these unknown words for your own definition like we have done in class.

Tuesday

You could think about what type of letter it is and you can then come up with the purpose for the letter. Once you have identified the purpose, you can start to think about what the main idea of the overall text is and additionally, what the main idea of each paragraph is.

Wednesday

You should be able to begin to answer the questions. Remember to use the reading strategies. To make this easier, I have grouped the questions into the different reading skills. Today, have a go at the retrieval questions to help you to navigate the text.

Retrieval

- 1. In which county does Ms P. Watson live?
- 2. What is the name of Lola's best friend?
- 3. What claims did the advert make about Almighty Chewing Gum? Name one.
- 4. What happened to Oskar when he tried the chewing gum?
- 5. What does Ms Watson think was wrong about Mrs Halloway's advert?

Thursday

Today, have a go at answering some different types of questions. The questions below are about the word choices, inference and prediction. Remember, underline the key words in the question, go back to the text and always check all possible answers. If it is a 'do you think' question, the answer isn't always in the text. It requires you to think about it using your own knowledge, supported by what is in the text.
