Your spelling rule for this week is spelling words with 'ch' that sound like 'k'

Echo, school, ache, character, chorus, chemical, Chris, Christmas, stomach, technical

Writing.

This week we are going to use a picture and our imagination to create a story. This is your OWN story there. Using the picture below write a story about what is happening in the picture. You will write this like any other story. It should have a beginning middle and end.



Use these questions prompts to help your imagination.

- Whose bedroom is this?
- What can you tell about his personality and interests?
- How old do you think the boy mouse is? Why?
- Which fairy tale do you think they might be reading?
- How long do you think they have been reading for?
- Do they read every night before bed?
- What is your favourite bedtime story? Has this changed over time?
- Do you prefer to be read to, to read aloud or read to yourself? Why?

Don't forget to include:

- Full stops and capital letters
- Subordinating conjunctions (if, so, because, which, when, however etc.)
- Fronted adverbials

Don't forget to check your writing for missing words, spellings and punctuation.

Use the sentence structure steps like we do in class:

1. Say your sentence out loud
2. Count how many words are in your sentence (using your fingers)
3. Write your sentence down
4. Re-read your sentence and check for any mistakes (punctuation, spellings, missing words etc.)
