How to Make a Treasure Map

Where would a pirate be without a treasure map? Lost, is the answer! Make your very own treasure map by following the instructions below.

Equipment:

paper, cold tea, felt-tip pens and string

Method:

1. First, collect your equipment together.
 2. Next, use your fingers to rip all the edges off a piece of paper.
 3. Then, pour cold tea all over the paper and leave the paper to dry.
 4. Once your paper is dry, draw the outline of an island on it.

8. Screw the paper into a ball then flatten the paper out again.
9. Lastly, roll your treasure map up. Tie a piece of string around it.
