This week your phonics focus is the spelling <oo>. This spelling can make the following sounds

oo like in m/oo/n.

oo like book

Draw this into your books:

oo oo

We're going to sort some words. We've done this lots of times before. Read the words and then write them into the correct category based on the sound the <oo> spelling makes.

e.g.
