This week, I would like you to complete some activities around this picture:



Best Friends

Monday

Answer the following questions:

How did their friendship start?

Where do you think they met?

Why have they become such close friends?

What do you think the girl has taught the giraffe?

What has she been preparing him for?

Where do you think she is leading him?

How do you think they are both feeling?

Tuesday

Think about where the girl is leading the giraffe. Can you draw where he will end up?

Wednesday

Can you write a sentence containing a relative clause?

E.g. The giraffe, who strode gracefully across the field with his long legs, wore a sad look on his face.

It splits the main clause.

The clause begins with 'who', 'which' or 'with'.

It must supply an extra bit of information to the sentences.

Commas should surround the relative clause.

Thursday

Make the following sentences even better (like we do when we edit and improve).

The girl led the giraffe He was brown and yellow He had long legs. They felt sad.

Friday

Write a story about the picture. Here is a starter for you.

They had always been together, for as long as he could remember. They had always been the best of friends. She had taught him everything he knew, relentlessly preparing for him for life in the outside world.

This was the moment they had both been waiting for...

When writing your story don't forget to include the following:

- Full stops and capital letters
- Subordinating conjunctions (if, so, because, when, which, however etc.)
- A variety of sentence openers
- Prepositions (before, after, during, in, because of)
- As well as anything else you usually include in your writing.
