Writing.

Task 1- Write a story about this picture use the questions prompts to help you.

Task 2- This week we are going to use a picture to create a letter from the boy to the shop owner. This letter can include your own reasons why you are writing a letter.

Remember for a letter you need to have a greeting, address and a conclusion.



Ideas to think about:

- What is the boy doing? Why?
- Why hasn't he gone inside the shop? Will he?
- Do you think he's a good or bad character?
- What do you know for certain about him?
- What can you infer?
- Imagine that the shopkeeper sees him at the window. Role play the conversation they might have. Now try it again, this time with a different outcome. (Writing opportunity: dialogue and/or play scripts.)
- How do you feel towards the boy?

Don't forget to include:

- Full stops and capital letters
- Subordinating conjunctions (if, so, because, which, when, however etc.)
- Fronted adverbials

Don't forget to check your writing for missing words, spellings and punctuation.

Use the sentence structure steps like we do in class:

- 1. Say your sentence out loud
- 2. Count how many words are in your sentence (using your fingers)
- 3. Write your sentence down
- 4. Re-read your sentence and check for any mistakes (punctuation, spellings, missing words etc.)
