Seesaw

We are going to begin using Seesaw to communicate, send homework and share work in school. Each child has received a login and you should have received a family login which will enable you to receive updates of some of the work your child does in class. Attendance

If your child is off for any reason, you must telephone the office to let us know. If a child is ill through sickness then they must stay off for 48 hours from the last time the child was sick. Research shows that good attendance is linked with higher achievement. If a child is off then it can have a serious impact on their education and at Corporation Road, we want all children to have the best possible start to their school career.

Nursery

In Nursery this term we have started 'Fabulous Friday'. Each Friday, the children have the opportunity to take part in interesting activities that are based around a topic. These activities also help promote the development of the children's speaking and listening, Maths, English and physical development skills. Fabulous Fridays this term have included a relaxation morning for Children's Mental Health Week, a teddy bears picnic, exploring flowers including still life painting and making models of our homes for DT. The children really look forward to our Fabulous Fridays and really enjoy taking part in the activities.



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Class 3

This term we have been learning about Transport. We have looked at old and new vehicles and talked about how they have changed. We had fun designing and making cars. We showed resilience by trying to make our cars better after we tested them in them to see if they worked. We used different materials to make the cars. During the week we went outside and made vehicles from large loose parts and worked together with our friends. We did a brilliant job!



Class 10



Over the course of the Spring Term, Year 6 have taken part in various projects. As part of the Intu Project pupils worked with Back Chat Brass and learnt how to play the trumpet and the trombone. They then performed alongside the band to the rest of the school. In addition, to the Intu Project, Year 6 have taken part in a six week Mini Police project, which involved them learning about healthy relationships. Also as part of this project they

met the local PCSOs, had the opportunity to look around a police van, try on police uniform and take part in a community project by litter picking in North Lodge Park.

Class 5

Year 2 have really enjoyed their learning in the wider curriculum this half term. We have learnt how to use a saw in DT, making our very own hospital beds. We have learnt how to create pictograms in computing and went on a Geography trip to collect data about different businesses in the town centre. We celebrated British Science week by investigating which material was the most absorbent. The children loved squirting water on the floor and then measuring how much water different materials soaked up.



Class 6



This term, our science topic has been forces and the children have really enjoyed investigating and learning about forces and different types of magnets. We have made predications about which surfaces would have the least amount of friction and put this to the test by racing cars down different surfaces. Our class novel this term was Charlie Changes into a Chicken, the children have really enjoyed reading this class book and found it very funny. Everyone gave it a five-star rating in our recent book review.

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Class 4

Throughout the Spring Term, Year 1 have been very busy. In English, we have been learning how to write instructions. A chef came to school and taught us how to make pancakes. We made the pancakes and wrote instructions for how to make them. In DT, we have made moving pictures using split pins. The moving pictures link to our topic of 'People Who Help Us'. In History, we have learnt about the Great Fire of London and the importance of the fire service.

Class 7

This term, Year 4 have been exploring maps. They've learnt about grid references and have used this to pinpoint Brazilian cities on maps. They have also explored ordnance survey maps and have learnt the symbols that are used to represent different human and physical features.



Class 8



This term in Year 5, we have taken part in a mini police project. We have worked to learn about the role of the police in our local community and even got to try on some of their uniform. Recently, we learnt all about the healthy relationships and why they are important. As part of a reward for working so hard, we also got to explore a police van! If you look closely, we have even locked up some of our children who didn't listen! Only joking!

A small group of children represented us at the Darlington Schools Dance Festival. They were amazing, well done! We have attended numerous sporting events this half term, well done to all involved!
