Maths:

Children will build upon our knowledge of place value, using numbers up to 100. We will be learning new ways of adding and subtracting 1-digit and 2-digit numbers. We will also begin to learn our times tables and learn how to multiply and divide.

Geography

Using maps children will locate the world's seven continents and five oceans. They will identify hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the equator and the North and South Poles.

R.E

Our key questions include: Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?

Who is Jewish and what do they believe? We will explore these questions, using stories, images and objects.

Careers

Children will explore the stereotypical idea of boy and girl jobs. We will then look at what jobs people we know do.

Science: Uses of everyday materials

Children will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for different uses. We will use this knowledge when carrying out scientific investigations.

Charanga: Hands, Feet and Heart.


The children will listen to different
